London Apl 30th.—Empire's Capital dressed up for Coronation in gala mood Friday night as thousands poured in City for most memorable English Football Cup Final in years. Game itself annual four star attraction at spacious Wembley and al-ways spectacular sight given added prominence when it was announced a few weeks ago that the King & Queen will attend. It marks their last appearance before huge crowd estimated at 93.000 before Coronation morning. In former years all modest transportation brought into play by Soccer enthusiasts representing practically every section of the country. Weekend excursions have been arranged from Durham and Lancashire and more than hundred trains from all directions will bring additional thousands citywards from dawn till game time Odds slightly favour Sunderland. Spanish Civil War.

EVACUATION OF CIVILIANS FROM BILBAO.

London, May 1st.—British merchantmen aid by British warships will carry out evacuation of civilians from Bilbao with or without the consent of Franco informed sources disclosed on Saturday. No Government official would admit receiving Franco's announced refusal to respect the ships evacuating refugees from the capital. Instead, it was stated, the Government "assumes that Franco will assent" to the move. The British warships have been ordered to protect the ships bearing refugees outside of the Spanish three mile limit. Authorized Spokesmen pointed out that Franco never before had interfered with ships leaving Spanish Government ports but only those seeking to enter ports.

Hendaye, May 1st.—Captains of a few British merchantmen are ignoring Spanish Insurgent refusals to respect any foreign ships inside their Bay of Biscay "blockade," agreed on Saturday to evacuate as many children as possible from Bilbao. Captains of nine ships which already reached Bilbao through Insurgent sea gauntlet said they hoped to be able to remove between four and five thousand children from St. Jean de Lux. They announced their plan after a conference with the British Consul at Bilbao, A. C. Stevenson. The ships which reached their anchorages in Nervion river to relieve food crisis of the war swollen population last week are Portlet, Hamsterley, Thurston, Marvia, Sheadfield, Backworth, Black-hill, Thorephall and Consett.

St. Jean de Luz, France, May 2nd-Gen Emilio Mola's Insurgents were reported in diplomatic dispatches to have smashed through last line Basque defences on Bay Biscay coast and to have reached the gates last arenas between Bilbao and sea.

London May 3rd.—Franco on Monday informed British Govt. he was opposed to plan to evacuate civilian population of Loyali-ts in Bilbao. His reply to the Govt's notification of the scheme to evacuate Bilbao received at the Foreign Office today. Note stated that Franco appreciated humanitarian reasons which dictated British move but neverthe-less disapproved. It was not thought that Insurgent note would change Govt's plans to lend naval aid beyond 3 mile evacuating limit to ships refugees.

St. Jean de Luz May 3rd.-Diplomatic quarters heard Monday that Spanish Govt. had sent biggest battleship 'Jaime Primero to Bay of Biscay appar ently in move to shell Insurgent lines around Basque Capital. British and French men of-war p trolled the Bay to protect "Espana."



New Harrison Liner.

The Passenger vessel "Inkosi" intended for the Harrison Line service between London and the West Indies was launched on February 25th at the Wallsendon-Tyne yard of Messrs Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson Limited.

She is expected to be completed in time to sail from London on her maiden voyage on June 18th. Her accommodation includes a good number of cabins with private bithrooms or shower bathrooms attached, the public rooms are to be decorated in a modern style, panelled chiefly in light woods. An up to-dote system of mechanical ventilation is being installed throughout the ship which should add greatly to the comfort of passengers during weather.

Each cabin will contain wardbes of good size, chests of drawers, full length mirrors, reading lights and lavatory basins fitted with running hot and cold water

The "Inkosi" when full will carry 83 passengers and it is obvious from the generous dimensions of the cabins that it has been the policy of the owners when planning the lay-out of the vessel to offer a high standard of comfort for this number rather than to make provision for a large number of passengers.




